Our Shared Ministry

Chad:

As a part of Lexington First UMC, we are a part of something bigger than ourselves. Andover is fortunate to be in a ministry that is closely shared with the Downtown and Offerings Communities. We are able to maintain the feel of a smaller church, while reaping the benefits of being a larger church. We see this in both our programming and administration. 50% of our budget giving goes beyond the direct ministry at Andover.

Jennifer:

The first 10% goes to our serve team and common mission partners. First Church has supported the operation of the High Street Neighborhood Center for decades, providing an affordable childcare option for families that need it the most.

Beyond that, our serve teams invest in ministries close to their community. At Andover, this looks like investment in the Garret Morgan backpack program, Nathaniel Mission, the United Methodist Homes for Children and Youth, Common Good, Embrace UMC, and more.

25% goes towards our shared administration. This includes support for our Sr. Pastor, Church Administrator, Office Manager, Administrative Assistants, and property manager. Beyond this shared staffing, it goes towards our insurance, vehicles, office supplies, printers and copiers, software costs, and much more.

11% goes towards supporting the United Methodist Church in KY and beyond through our apportionment giving. This provides for our district, conference, and general church operations.

4% of giving is set aside for Community and Leadership development.

Chad:

We were able to launch Andover because we were part of something bigger. Through our shared ministry, we had the people and funds to launch 16 years ago. It is through our shared ministry that we have been able to navigate hard times. And it is through our shared ministry that we can do ministry contextually.

Each Sunday, someone will be at the Welcome Center in the Gathering Hall after worship, ready to answer any questions you might have. Thank you for your support of Andover, and our common ministry at First Church.

3. Keeping an eye out for upcoming opportunities to help with a decorations day.


